<u>Introduction</u> Section Score: ____ / 8

- 1. Grabs attention with a hook
- 2. Clearly defines/establishes the focus and context for the essay
- 3. Provides a clear, pronged thesis which forecasts organization for the essay
- 4. Provides an interesting and appropriate opening for the subject matter and intended audience

Organization/Structure Section Score: ____ / 15

- 1. Contains a distinct introductory paragraph, required number of body paragraphs, and a distinct concluding paragraph
- 2. Body paragraphs follow the structure forecast from the thesis
- 3. Body paragraphs break at logical places and clearly separate topics of discussion
- 4. Transitions are used appropriately to connect sentences and paragraphs and establish overall flow
- 5. All paragraphs are unified around the primary thesis concept/main argument of the essay (coherence)
- 6. Sentences within paragraphs progress logically toward both the sub-argument of that paragraph and the overall primary argument of the essay
- 7. Establishes logical progression within and between sentences and paragraphs (coherence)
