CHECKLIST

1. GRAMMAR & WORDING SCAN	
Are my sentences as concise as possib	Have I passed readability scans through HemingwayApp and/or Grammarly?
Is everything worded clearly with no unintentional ambiguity?	Is my content error- and typo-free?
2. READ-ALOUD	
When read aloud, are there any par	rts that seem clumsy or confusing?
3. GIVE IT TIME	
If possible, have I set my writing asi	de for a few days so that I can see it with fresh eyes?
4. CHUNK IT & MIX IT	
Have I looked at my story section-by-section, even out of order, to ensure each section is error-free and makes sense when read independently?	
5. READ & NOTE	
Have I read through my writing as a READER, making notes about what readers might think or feel while reading?	
Have I noted anything that readers may find confusing or any gaps in information that may need expanding in order to keep readers from becoming lost?	
6. LISTEN	
Have I had someone else read the semphasis, inflection, or reader inte	tory aloud to me, so that I can catch any problems with rpretation?
7. PRE- & POST-OUTLINING	
Have I compared the actual conten	t of each paragraph to my original plan or outline?
Does the final content include ever	ything I intended, with no unnecessary tangents?
If writing a novel, are all the appro	priate plot points and genre conventions present?

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
